# Welcome to Sorell School

Welcome to Sorell School. We are proudly the oldest continually operating public school in Australia having provided education and care on the same site for children and families of the Sorell community since the school opened in 1821.

We are mindful of honoring the unique relationship our community and school have enjoyed these past 200 historic years and we are determined to continue to provide relevant high-quality education for learners of all ages as they embrace a future that offers many exciting opportunities and challenges. We recognise that Sorell sits in the middle of the South East Region of Tasmania and at the gateway to the Tasman Peninsula and East Coast. Based on the unique geographical location we envisage an emerging role for Sorell School as a Centre for education and training for the South East Region.

At Sorell School we offer birth to adult learning experiences in purposefully designed facilities. Beginning with our first Five years Launching into Learning and Kindergarten experiences through to our Years 11-12, adult education and training programs.

Our school includes unique educational opportunities such as a School Farm and a Heritage Village that add outstanding "hands-on, minds-on" contexts for our learning programs.

The Tasmanian State Government has committed significant capital works funding that will see a complete re-development of Sorell School over the next few years. The works will include a combination of new buildings and refurbishment of existing facilities. Most recently the Government announced additional capital investment to fund the building of a Child and Family Learning Centre (CFLC), to be co-located on the Sorell School site.

We are at the beginning of an exciting and seminal period in Sorell School's long and proud history. We look forward to continuing to strengthen and grow our partnerships with families, businesses and organisations already linked to our school and to welcoming new families into our community.

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#### Attendance

If your student is absent, please alert the office via one of the following methods:

- Phone the school office on 03 6269 1100.
- Respond to the text message regarding absence that is sent out after 10am
- Alert us via the Absentee button in the SchoolZine App.
- Provide the student with a signed note when they return to school. The student should give this note to the Home Group/Class teacher, who will forward it to the school office.
- To enable us to meet our duty of care, students are required to immediately enter and remain in the school grounds once they disembark from both public and private transport in the morning.
- At the end of the school day, students are required to stay on school campuses if they are catching the bus home, they are not to leave school premises and then return to catch the bus.
- If students are not catching the bus, they are to leave the school premises at the completion of the day.

## Arriving Late or Leaving Early

- Any students arriving late must report to the school office with a parent/guardian to sign in before going to class.
- A Parent/guardian must be present or contact the office before students sign out and leave the school site.

#### Injury or Illness

- Should your child be injured or unwell they should present at the Administration Building where first aid officers are available.
- First aid staff will assess your child and then proceed to take the appropriate action.
- · You will be contacted if it is deemed necessary.
- Sorell School is not in a position to look after sick or injured children.
- No medical or nursing personnel are employed at the school.
- Up-to-date contact numbers, including emergency phone numbers are essential.

To make an appointment with our Support Team parents/guardians can ring the school office. Students can make an appointment through assistance from their class teacher or Grade Leader.

#### **Volunteers and Visitors**

Volunteers and Visitors must sign in at Administration and hold a current Working With Vulnerable People Card (WWVP). If you don't have a WWVP card a staff member will chaperone you through the school grounds.

While on school grounds or at a school activity, everyone has the right to be safe and be treated fairly and respectfully.

This means that everyone at our school agrees:

- We behave in a safe and respectful manner
- · We work together to support & adhere to learning

If unacceptable behaviour is displayed on school grounds or at a school activity the principal (or their delegate) may ask you to leave. Note: a request by a principal that an adult leaves must be respected and complied under the DECYP Act 2016.

#### **Mobile Phones and Electronic Devices**

In line with DECYP, phones are not permitted to be used at Sorell School between the hours of 8:50am and 3:00pm. Parents are to contact students via the office if required. It is important that critical issues continue to be communicated directly through the school office to ensure your child is adequately supported.

The responsibility for the safe keeping of a mobile phone, if brought to school, rests with the student.

Students are permitted access to electronic devices to support learning. These devices are supported by on-site IT staff and are stored securely at school. All students and parents/guardians are required to sign an ICT agreement. The devices are available for student use during class time, as prescribed by teachers. Students are expected to look after the devices and follow all protocols in relation to responsible ICT, including appropriate storage of equipment. Any breach of the ICT agreement or not handling devices responsibly will result in IT access being removed from the student.

#### Travel – Bus and Car

Bus timetables are available at the school office.

All students will be provided with a copy of the Code of Behaviour. In the event of non-compliance, bus drivers may issue written warning to students. If a student continues to offend, they may face suspension from the bus for a set period. If a major problem occurs, suspension may result without warning.

Upon arrival to school, students must enter and remain in the school grounds. If your child catches the Levendale bus or has a younger sibling that requires assistance, they are permitted to apply for a bus pass.

To apply for and obtain a bus pass, parents will need to contact to their class teacher or office via phone, email, written note or in person.

Students in Year 11 and 12 who have their licence may drive to school. They are required to provide information to the office about the registration of the car they are driving at the start of the year, or when they begin driving. Students are always expected to drive responsibly and at the designated speed whilst on school grounds. Students are not permitted to park in staff carparks.





#### **Houses/House Colours**

Our school has three houses:

- Davis (Yellow)
- Bridges (Blue)
- Hart (Red)

Students will be allocated a house. Where possible, students will be in the same house as any siblings. The allocation to houses is dependent on student numbers.

#### **Breakfast Club and Canteen**

Breakfast Club will operate daily from 8.30 in the mina nina krakani building. Our school canteen provides healthy food at recess and lunch every day of the week, as well as other refreshments at reasonable prices.
